Meeting Summary

Welcome:

Dr. Jeannie Davis welcomed everyone to the meeting and led introductions.

Dr. Jeannie Davis noted that the medical college is looking at a master's degree in behavioral health and how to impact those individuals of greatest need.

Addressing Violence in Rural Oregon Communities Grant:

JoAnn Miller reported on the Addressing Violence in Rural Oregon Communities Grant.

- Mid-Valley Healthcare, Inc. dba Samaritan Lebanon Community Hospital (SLCH) applied for a HRSA Rural Health Network Development Grant requesting \$1,200,000 over four years to develop the capacity of the Coast to the Cascades Community Wellness Network (CCCWN) to address violence in rural communities. The Addressing Violence in Rural Oregon Communities Project will focus on child abuse, domestic violence, and human trafficking in Lincoln and east Linn Counties. We were successful in receiving this grant.
- Partners on the grant include ABC House, Acosta Services, CARDV, Sarah's Place and the Linn-Benton Anti-trafficking Coalition.
- Linn, Benton, Lincoln Partners for Health will oversee the grant as the subcommittee that will report up to the CCCWN.
- The grant will cover certain activities of the Linn-Benton Anti-Trafficking Coalition. Elizabeth Bauermeister is the Coordinator for this group. She will attend the Partners for Health meetings.
- A Violence Prevention Summit for Lincoln and east Linn Counties will be scheduled – one in East Linn County and one in Lincoln County. There will be \$30,000 available for the Violence Prevention Summits.
- Sommer McLeish will be the Project Director for the grant and will begin in her new role on July 17, 2023.
- Maisa Athamneh and Mary Landis are meeting with sub-awardees on contracts.
- One meeting has been held with all the partners on the grant and another meeting will be scheduled soon.
- Luis Acosta - Acosta Services, is part of the grant and will be working with the Spanish population.
- We are looking at trying to find additional resources and financial commitment to do similar work in Benton County and in Albany.
- CARDV will provide services for East Linn County as part of the grant.
- At the Reverse Site Visit in Washington, D.C., earlier in the month discussed with the Federal Office of Rural Programs how we can leverage when we have rural community and have connected communities such as Benton County and Albany and trying to do a regional approach.

2023 Summit:

Discussion focused on the 2023 Summit. A spreadsheet for the summit was noted.

- **Date for the event** – August 25, 2023. This will be an in-person event only.
- **Theme** – “Whole Person Approach to Health.”
- **Location** – Center for Healthcare Education in Newport.
- **Dr. Jeannie Davis** – She met with JoAnn Miller and Shelagh Baird to get things pulled together for the summit.
- **Current Workshops:**

 - b. Mental Wellbeing – Kari Hart, MSW, LCSW, Samaritan Health Services (SHS)
 - c. Youth Services – River Aaland, Ophelia’s Place
- The Cooking Demonstration will engage everyone.
- A panel discussion will follow the Cooking Demonstration toward the end of the summit. Dr. Robert Fallows, Elizabeth Bauermeister, and Shannon Snair will be part of the panel discussion with a mental health/suicide and human trafficking focus.
- **Food** – Confirmed with Ultralife.
- **Keynote Speaker** – Dr. Kelly Gonzalez.
 - a. **Mac Gillespie** – Should he still reach out to Nigel Wrangem?
 - b. **JoAnn Miller** – “No,” we are good now.
- **Closing** – Dr. Lesley Ogden has confirmed to provide the closing for the summit.
- **Land Acknowledgement and Drumming Group** – A representative from the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians will provide a land acknowledgement during the Welcome. We have asked if the youth drumming group, part of the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians, could provide lunch entertainment.

- d. We can look at the possibility of agencies sharing a table. We are looking at agencies that provide direct services and especially those agencies that provide services around child abuse, domestic violence, and human trafficking.
 - e. **Sommer McLeish** – Noticed that Parent Success Network was not listed. Since we are doing a workshop related to this, would like to add them to the list for a table.
 - f. It was noted that Phoenix Wellness Center is hard to get a hold of.
 - g. **Jolynn Meza Wynkoop** – What about the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians?
 - h. **Mac Gillespie** – *Can check if anyone from Benton County Health Department might want a table.* He indicated someone would want a table from Benton County.
 - i. We may want to look at including the other Health Departments as well in Linn County and Lincoln County. *JoAnn Miller noted she would reach out to Justin Thomas and Isabelle Cisco.*
 - j. Deb Fell-Carlson had expressed interest in being part of the summit with Faith-Based Nursing. She will be invited to have a resource table.
 - k. We can check to see if we can get any additional tables or if twelve (12) tables is the limit for the room. *Shelley Hazelton will follow up.*
 - l. We may want to include 211 and Shannon Rose.
 - m. Could see if Linn-Benton Health Equity Alliance would like a resource table.
 - n. *JoAnn Miller agreed to send out an email to those organizations listed above and invite them to have a resource table to see who might be interested.*
- **Mac Gillespie** – Is there an email or registration link to promote the summit?
 - a. **Jolynn Meza Wynkoop** – Created an Eventbrite page and have reached out to Luis Acosta to have a Spanish version available as well. We can get the registration flyer send out for registering.
 - **JoAnn Miller** – The main conference rooms A/B seat seventy-two (72). This is people at tables. Can we add chairs around the outside of the room to fit additional people? *Shelley Hazelton will follow up with Kathy Brier or Amy Conner.*
 - **JoAnn Miller** – We should be able to set the upstairs conference rooms to theater style. Is there the capability to stream upstairs?
 - a. **Sommer McLeish** – Look at streaming he keynote speaker that will be presenting downstairs in the big rooms to a TV upstairs in case we get extra people. They do have a TV upstairs. *Shelley Hazelton will follow up with Kathy Brier.*
 - **Jolynn Meza Wynkoop** – We can give attendees colored dots and speakers can rotate between the conference rooms.
 - What is the number of headsets for interpretation?
 - a. **Luis Acosta** – If there are like thirty five (35) in the room – Probably the biggest is 20. Could look at borrowing some equipment.
 - **Mac Gillespie** – Is there a limit on the number of attendees based on food?
 - a. **JoAnn Miller** – There is no limit based on food.
 - **JoAnn Miller** – Keynote speaker – Will pay speaker fee, mileage, and per diem.
 - **Dr. Jeannie Davis** – Last year, had \$2,500 money that was released to us that we did not use. Western University Oregon still has this.
 - a. **JoAnn Miller** – We could use the money and bill part of the lunches to Western University Oregon.
 - **Jolynn Meza Wynkoop** – *Can reach out to speakers and presenters.*
 - Who will be doing the land acknowledgement and the youth drumming circle?
 - a. **JoAnn Miller** – She is waiting to hear from Ruby Moon.
