Welcome:

Dr. Jeannie Davis welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Meeting Minutes:

The committee did not review the minutes from the January 13, 2026 meeting of Linn, Benton, Lincoln Partners for Health Coalition.

Addressing Violence in Rural Oregon Communities (AVIROC) Update

- CARDV provided presentations for MS/HS students in rural Linn County. They have eight different presentations they can offer. Each presentation comes with a letter that goes home to parents and is a form of reinforcing material that gets taught in class. Each presentation touches on different forms of violence.
- Kristin is the interim director with CARDV and is the person doing the presentations in the schools (Sweet Home).
- CARDV is doing a social media campaign and an intern with OSU was assisting with this in the past.
- Question in the chat: Does CARDV have a satellite location in Lebanon? The conversation concluded that we aren't aware if there is one in Lebanon.
- Acosta Services is working in Lincoln County and is formulating an action plan.
- Acosta Services did a training on Human Trafficking on January 28th, 2026 with Lizzie Martinez.
- Today (2/10/26) and tomorrow (2/11/26) there are human trafficking trainings focused on educating workers in the hospitality industry. This is being hosted by Gae Linfoot and a someone in law enforcement. Acosta Services will be providing Spanish interpretation for these trainings.
- Sarah's Place will come to the Partners for Health meeting next month to present about their services.
- The AVIROC Marketing Plan was submitted and accepted by HRSA.
- The AVIROC Work Plan had to be resubmitted for a language update.
- Sommer will connect with Dr. Jeannie Davis & Tasha at Sarah's Place to potentially have a Human Trafficking training at Comp-NW. Sommer mentioned there were grant dollars that could be used to host a training.

2026 Summit Update

- Registration for the summit will open on March 15th.

- The summit will take place at Samaritan Lebanon Community Hospital on Friday, May 22nd from 9AM-3PM.
- There will be a Family Night on Thursday, May 21st from 6-8PM at the Boys and Girls Club in Lebanon. A meal will be provided and there will be a guest speaker by the keynote. Dr. Davis is working on getting the BGC the appropriate liability documents. The BGC will be available to us for free.
- There will be an art activity at the summit called Guided Drawing. A film was shown that explains the art activity. [What is Guided Drawing?](#) Participants paint or draw with their eyes closed. They use their emotions through their hands to express themselves. This therapy is a non-verbal treatment. The trainer will bring all of their own materials.
