**Welcome/Introductions:**

Heidi May-Stoulil, Chair, welcomed everyone to the meeting and led introductions.

**Meeting Minutes:**

The committee reviewed the minutes from the May 12, 2025, meeting of the Regional Mental Health/Substance Use Disorder Coalition. **Josh Pankau moved to approve the minutes as presented, with Shelagh Baird seconding. Members unanimously approved the motion.**

**Federal/State Grants Reports and Updates:**

**Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) Rural Communities Opioid Response Program – Implementation (RCORP-I) – Helping Impact Women and Youth (HIWAY) Project Grant for Lincoln County:**

Members noted the HRSA RCORP-I HIWAY Project Grant report and Work Plan Highlights distributed prior to the meeting. Jolynn Meza Wynkoop provided a brief update on the grant.

- The grant ends at the end of August 2025.
- Submitted a “draft” sustainability plan the end of May. A final plan is due at the end of July 2025.
- Working with Brandan Kearney, Consultant, and Luis Acosta, Acosta Services to put together reports for the grant that we will be adding to the CCCWN website.
- Had the Community Conversations at the end of May. For the coastal events - There were 8 in attendance at the Newport event and 21 attendees for Lincoln City.
- Will also provide outreach at the end of June with the “Recovery City” film screenings that follow four women through recovery. We will fly out the filmmaker and one of the film’s participants.

We will show the film on June 26, 2025, at the Lincoln City Cultural Center with the film screening from 6:15 p.m. – 7:45 p.m. with a question-and-answer session from 7:45 pm – 8:30 p.m. There will be a couple of partners helping with the event.

- On June 27, 2025, we will also be having a “Celebrating Women in Recovery” event in Newport with a dinner, dessert, and craft activity. We will show the same documentary, “Recovery City” and we will provide free childcare.

**Shelagh Baird moved to approve the HRSA RCORP-I HIWAY Project Grant report and Work Plan highlights as presented, with Jesse Noble seconding. Members unanimously approved the motion.**

#### **Update – Regional Overdoses:**

Discussions followed around regional overdoses.

- **Shelagh Baird** – Shared information from the Samaritan Health Services Individual Overdose Report for Reporting Period: May 1, 2025 – May 31, 2025.
  - a. Good Samaritan Regional Medical Center (GSRMC) – 4 overdoses.
  - b. Samaritan Albany General Hospital (SAGH) – 6 overdoses.
  - c. Samaritan Lebanon Community Hospital (SLCH) – 8 overdoses.
  - d. Samaritan North Lincoln Hospital (SNLH) – 2 overdoses.
  - e. Samaritan Pacific Communities Hospital (SPCH) – 4 overdoses.

#### **Samaritan Health Services – Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS)/Neonatal Opioid Withdrawal Syndrome (NOW) numbers:**

- a. Good Samaritan Regional Medical Center (GSRMC) – 0.
  - b. Samaritan Albany General Hospital (SAGH) – 3.
  - c. Samaritan Lebanon Community Hospital (SLCH) – 0.
  - d. Samaritan North Lincoln Hospital (SNLH) – 0.
  - e. Samaritan Pacific Communities Hospital (SPCH) – 0.
- Shelagh Baird shared and noted the 2025 Data – Drug overdose encounters by hospital in 2025. Shared information from January 2025 through May 2025.
  - Shelagh Baird indicated that she did not include law enforcement data and ***will try to reach out to Linn and Lincoln County for information to collate as well.***
  - **Emily Yeast** – Is wondering about the discrepancy in NAS for SAGH and GSRMC. It does not make sense from what she knows about perinatal substance use disorder (SUD) for those two hospitals. She noted there might be a reporting error or difference in how it is being diagnosed.
  - **Shelagh Baird** – She does receive the hospital overdose data numbers from an Epic automated generation. ***Can check on this. Will follow up with Emily Yeast.***
  - **Dr. David Simmons** – For Shelagh Baird - Please keep him and Dr. Jennifer Smits posted on what you find out about data quality there? We are trying to keep an eye on that and respond appropriately.
  - **Jef Van Arsdall – Benton County Sheriff** – Can check the Overdose Detection Mapping Application Program (ODMAP) through Chief of Police, Marcia Harnden. Not sure if Linn County and Lincoln County have access yet. May want to follow up with the sheriffs.
  - **Marcia Harnden – Albany Chief of Police** – Do manual collection record – Can see limited access to Lebanon and Sweet Home. Can always send information.
  - You may want to check with Jami Glass, Benton County Sheriff’s Office as well.

- **Jesse Noble** – Have requested access to ODMAP. Hope to have for Linn, Benton, and Lincoln Counties.
- **Jef Van Arsdall – Benton County Sheriff** – Blue Valentine also has a more accurate count for what is outside in the community separate from law enforcement. Law enforcement data shows 911 was called and law enforcement responded.
- **Jesse Noble** – Has a regional overdose form that will go out to Benton, Lincoln, and Linn Counties for writing down individual plans. It is currently not in place yet. Working on overdose response plans with a separate plan for each county. Completed Lincoln County’s overdose response plan and will support the other counties with their plans. Is creating the regional overdose response template. Looking to incorporate ODMAP as a resource as well.

### **Behavioral Health Resource Networks (BHRN) Update:**

Coalition members provided Behavioral Health Resource Networks updates.

- **Thien Nguyen – Linn County:**
  - a. Ending the current BHRN cycle at the end of the month and the next funding cycle will begin. There will be site visits with the new cycle and new reporting platforms. There will be training for those new reporting platforms.
  - b. Community Conversations went well in Linn County.
  - c. Will be having “Recovery City” film screening in Lebanon on June 24, 2025, at the Santiam Place Wedding and Event Hall from 7:00 p.m. – 9:30 p.m. On June 25, 2025, there will be a “Recovery City” film screening at the Russell Tripp Performance Center, Takena Hall at Linn-Benton Community College in Albany from 7:00 p.m. – 9:30 p.m.
- **Avalon Mason** – No report for Benton County – Business as usual.
- **Josh Pankau:**
  - a. Family Tree Relief Nursery will have a Certified Peer Mentor training July 7-11, 2025, and again starting October 6, 2025. Please call the front desk for more information. This is free in-person training – Family Tree Relief Nursery - Front desk - 541-967-6508.
  - b. Waiting to hear from Oregon Health Authority for a 10-day Traditional Healthcare Worker Peer Support training. Scheduled training through the remainder of next year.
